Registration and Recordation Certificates:

- Only American Dairy Goat Association, American Goat Society and Canadian Goat Society registered, recorded or applied for animals, that are recognized by ADGA as dairy animals, may be shown in official American Dairy Goat Association shows.
- A registration or recordation certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older.
- A registration or recordation certificate or a stamped duplicate application showing the date received by the ADGA office is required for all animals under six months of age. Show officials shall not accept copies of the aforesaid, any other document in lieu of them, or information obtained from the ADGA office via telephone, etc.
- A stamped duplicate is valid for 30 days from the ADGA office date stamped on it.
- The document for that animal to be shown must be handed to the show official who shall read it and compare its information to that on its entry form and verify the information on both.
- All names included on one identification number constitute only one membership; therefore, only one exhibitor. Only the ID number on the registration/recordation certificate or on the stamped duplication application is proof of ownership.
- Persons showing animals whose registration or recordation certificates have signed transfers that have not been processed by the ADGA office must show those animals in the owner's name shown on ADGA records at that time.
- Animals with natural horns shall not be shown.

Health Requirements:

Wyoming law requires all out-of-state goats be accompanied by a valid health certificate (CVI). A Scrapie Premise ID number may be required to obtain the import permit, please note that tattoos accompanying a matching registration paper are acceptable Scrapie ID in Wyoming. A press release attesting to this is available on the Wyoming Livestock Board website. Health certificates will be verified at time of check-in. Diseased or injured animals will be removed from the grounds upon recommendation of the show committee. Animals deemed unworthy of competition by the show committee may be barred from the competition and removed from the grounds. In such cases, pen and entry fees submitted by the owner will be forfeited.

Milk out at your own discretion, over-uddered does will be discriminated against.

Grooming:

Do not clip your goats for this show. Clipped goats will not be allowed to enter the show ring. The following areas may be trimmed for judging purposes: udder, excess hair on the back of legs if it obscures the udder or escutcheon, inside of ears or tails for viewing tattoos. **No body clip.** All goats must be dehorned or naturally polled.

Youth Showmanship:

Showmanship class will begin promptly at scheduled times. Seniors (14-19) and Peewee (under 8) will show concurrently, followed by Junior (8-10) and Intermediate (11-13). Ages as of January 1 of the current year.

Champion Challenge:

Permanent Champions may be shown in the regular or the challenge class, whichever the owner chooses. The Grand Champion of the same show must be shown in these classes and the winners of them shall be called "Best of Breed." Permanent Champions shown in these classes are not to be barred from udder classes. Proof of Championship shall be either: (1) The prefix CH, GCH, or SGCH as affixed by ADGA on the animal's registration or recordation certificate; or (2) Presentation of the Permanent Champion Certificate Notification Letter issued by ADGA in conjunction with the original registration or recordation certificate. The letter is valid for use until December 31 of the year of issuance. The winner of the Champion Challenge class must compete in in the "Best in Show" class. An animal winning Grand Champion without Champion Challenge or Best of Breed, where Champion Challenge is contested, will forfeit the championship leg earned in the show if they fail to compete in the Best of Show class.

Sponsorship:

Classes may be sponsored by herds, individuals, clubs, or businesses for \$25.00 per class. The sponsor may hang a banner in the ring and will be announced during the class. Please specify which class you would like to sponsor on the entry form.

Dogs:

Dogs are not allowed in the penning area or barns. Service dogs are welcome following ADA guidelines.

Pens:

Pen size is approximately 4'x5'x5'.



Feed and Bedding:

Bring your own feed or check with local businesses. Shavings available by pre-order only.

Milking competition:

ADGA sanctioned Milking Competition is for owners who would like to earn a *M status for their does. The competition will be held on Friday and Saturday. The preliminary milk out will be held Friday at 6:30 pm (this weight does not count but is just to verify that the doe is starting out with an empty udder) with the two weighed milkings at 6:30 am and 6:30 pm on Saturday. The cost for the lab fee is paid for by Meadowlark Testing Association. There will be a one-hour time frame for completion of the test. Tattoos and paperwork will be completed Friday night prior to the preliminary milk out. Participants must provide: milk stand, bucket, registration papers, container if milk is to be saved, and enough milk hands and stands to accomplish the test in one hour. If this competition is to be used for a Verification Test for DHIR, the owner must have the VT paperwork filled out also. Sign up under M.C. on entry form.

Lodging:

Camping and bathrooms available at the fairgrounds. Contact the Laramie County Fair Complex at Archer for camping fees at 307-633-4670.

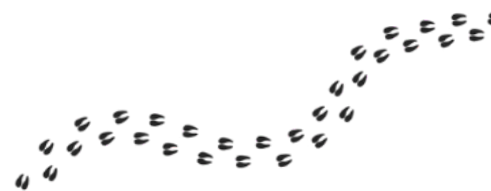
Arrival times:

Pens will be available Friday starting at 1:00 pm. Check-in from 4-8 pm on Friday or by arrangement with the entry chair if arriving after 8 pm on Friday. All animals must be in place and checked in prior to the start of the show.

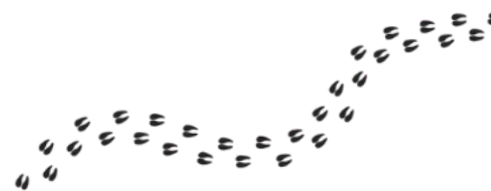


Classes:

- The base date for classes is May 30, 2021.
- Buck classes: Classes 1–6.
- Senior/junior combined doe classes: All senior does shown in this division must have freshened at least once or are regularly milked (e.g., precocious doe milked daily). Junior does must be under 24 months and never freshened. Classes 7–13.
- Junior doe classes: This division is comprised of doelings under 24 months of age that have never freshened. Classes 14–18.
